Imposed a 1% surcharge on taxable wages for employers April 1, 1982 through March 31, 1983. NO vote IFL position. Ayes 12 Nays 38.
- 12. Senate Amendment S-5389B to Senate Amendment S-5353 to Senate File 2273 (Balancing the unemployment trust fund and repaying any loans made by the federal government to Iowa). Froze benefits at the July 1, 1981 level through July 2, 1983. NO vote IFL position. Ayes 8 Nays 40 Absent 2.
- 13. Senate Amendment S-5389C to Senate Amendment S-5353 to Senate File 2273 (Balancing the unemployment trust fund and repaying any loans made by the federal government to Iowa). Seasonal employees would not be able to collect unemployment benefits in January, February or March. NO vote IFL position. Ayes 13 Nays 36 Absent 1.
- 14. Senate Amendment S-5544 to Senate File 2300 (Relates to the regulation of financial institutions). Removed the payment of interest on escrow accounts at savings and loan institutions. NO vote IFL position. Ayes 21 Nays 27 Absent 2.
- 15. House File 777, allows a business to assign its collections to a collection agency and take you to small claims court without notice. NO vote IFL position. Ayes 38 Nays 7 Absent 5.
- 16. Senate Amendment S-5592 to Senate File 2304 (Relating to and making supplemental appropriations July 1, 1982 June 30, 1983). Increased appropriation for public transit purposes to implement a state assistance plan from \$1,908,000 to \$2,000,000. YES vote IFL position. Ayes 23 Nays 27.
