

Samuel Gompers said it best when he described labor's political mission nearly a century ago: "Stand faithfully by our friends and elect them; oppose our enemies and defeat them, whether they be candidates for President, for Congress, or other offices, whether executive, legislative or judicial."

Not words but the record is the measure of how we separate labor's allies from our adversaries. This voting record by no means covers all the issues that the lowa Federation of Labor, AFL-CIO dealt with during the 1996 Legislative session. It does, however, record legislators' votes on a number of key issues of concern to union members and their families and will help lowa trade unionists determine whether their elected representatives support labor's progressive agenda or have taken their stand with those who want to keep working people down.

Senate Issues -- 1996

- 1. Amendment S-5063 to HF 2114 limits CEBA grants to businesses that pay wages of at least 100% of the county average. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 27 22)
- 2. SF 2409 provides for the new Workforce Development Department, including statutory state and regional boards with equal representation by business and labor, the labor representatives being appointed by the governor from nominations by statewide labor organizations. Private contractors must pay the same wages and benefits as those paid to public workers for comparable positions. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 33 16)

 Amended by the House
- 3. HF 2416 -- provides for an employer surcharge to continue the Second Injury Fund, protecting benefits for injured workers. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 31 15)
- 4. SF 2341 relates to components of the unemployment system, including the provision that the 125% requirement be eliminated. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 29 20) Died in House Committee
- 5. SF 2443 appropriates funds for the Department of Employment Services and the Department of Economic Development; includes reporting of all assistance or benefits provided under state economic development programs and the consideration of a "good neighbor agreement" between businesses and communities. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 33 17) House amended reporting requirements
- 6. S-5767 to S-5700 to HF 2421 provides that local bond issues may be passed with a simple majority when funded by a combination of income and property tax, promoting the rebuilding of infrastructure and providing jobs. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 32 17) Died in Conference Committee
- 7. SF 2449 provides for property tax cuts, business tax cuts and tax credits for family farm operations, but does not include a low-income "circuit breaker," thus excluding tax relief for those who paid for the current state surplus through the regressive 1992 sales tax increase. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 43-6)
- 8. SF 2245 makes improvements in IPERS, including increasing the minimum monthly benefits, removing the covered wage ceiling, increasing the maximum number of years of employment used to compute benefits, and expanding the early retirement option. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 48 0)

House Issues -- 1996

- 1. HJR 2003 -- proposes a Constitutional amendment that would limit the terms of state officials and legislators, taking away voters' rights to choose freely who will represent them. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 61 39) Died in Senate Committee
- 2. Amendment H-5078 to H-4229 to HF 258 -- allows employers greater latitude to test employees for drugs and alcohol . IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 59 36)
- 3. HF 258 final vote on drug testing bill including anti-labor amendments attached by the House. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 77 18) Died in Senate; Senate passed a different version which died in the House
- 4. HF 61 provides employers immunity when giving references on employees to other employers, unless employee can prove employer deliberately provided false information. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 64 32) Died in Senate
- 5. HF 2449 -- puts limits on campaign contributions, but not on campaign spending; makes payroll deductions for PAC's illegal. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 62 35) Amended by Senate; died in House
- 6. Amendment H-5507 to H-5495 to HF 2412 -- allows industrial disability to be considered in awarding benefits for more than one injury. IFL position was "YES." (Failed 35 60)
- 7. Amendment H-5457 to H-5419 to SF 2443 -- provides for reporting of all assistance or benefits provided under state economic development programs and the consideration of a "good neighbor agreement" between businesses and communities. IFL position was "YES." (Failed 37 56)
- 8. HF 2362 -- lessens employer responsibility for hearing loss due to job-related noise. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 61 36) Died in Senate
- 9. Amendment H-5559 to H-5478 to SF 2442 increases funding for child care by approximately \$6 million. IFL position was "YES." (Failed 38 57)
- 10. Amendment H-5698 to HF 2481 -- gives incentive benefits to supporting businesses only if the contractor or subcontractor pays at least the prevailing wage. IFL position was "YES." (Failed 39 61)
- 11. Amendment H-5790 to H-5600 to SF 2409 -- retained labor positions on the state Workforce Development Board with Governor's appointments to be made from nominations by statewide labor organizations. IFL position was "YES." (Failed 36 58)
- 12. Amendment H-5789 to H-5600 to SF 2409 -- provides for implementation of a classification plan for the new Workforce Development Department to be agreed upon by the Department of Personnel and the certified employee organization representatives of the bargaining unit. IFL position was "YES." (Failed 35 60)
- 13. Amendment H-5787 to H-5600 to SF 2409 -- reinstates language limiting privatization in the Workforce Development Department to contractors who pay wages and benefits equal to those paid public workers in comparable positions. IFL position was "YES." (Failed 37 59)
- 14. SF 2449 -- provides for property tax breaks, business tax breaks and tax credits for family farm operations, but does not include a low-income "circuit breaker," excluding those who paid for the current state surplus through the regressive 1992 sales tax increase. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 97 0)
- 15. SF 2245 makes improvements in IPERS, including increasing the minimum monthly benefit, removing the covered wage ceiling, increasing the maximum number of years of employment used to compute benefits, and expanding the early retirement option. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 95 0)
