Senate Issues – 1998

- 1. HF 299 repeals Iowa's drug testing law and replaces it with a private sector only statute that allows random testing, does not guarantee treatment, and gives employers protection from liability. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 26-22)
- 2. SF 2333 cuts benefits for workers who suffer occupational hearing loss. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 27-21)
- 3. SF 540 maintains benefits for injured workers under the Second Injury fund by allowing for increased assessment of employers. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 47-0)
- 4. HF 2513 cuts taxes on capital gains, increases pension exemption, increases tuition tax credits, exempts non-profit hospitals from sales tax, doubles personal income tax exemption, which, in the aggregate, gives most of the benefits to upper-income Iowans. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 44-5)
- 5. S-5642 increases amount of pension exemption by \$3000 for single filers and \$6000 for joint filers, but phases out the increase for those who make more than \$34,000 (single) or \$44,000 (joint). IFL position was "YES." (Failed 20-30)
- 6. S-5696 sets up a fund to pay for property tax breaks for low-income persons. This legislation was passed in 1992 to soften the effect of the sales tax increase, but never funded. IFL position was "YES." (Failed 23-25)
