- 1) Amendment S-5013 to H. F. 2072, PROPERTY TAX BILL - allowed cities discretion in increasing budgets up to 5% over previous year without appeal. Yes vote IFL position. Ayes 16 - Nays 31 - Absent 3.
- 2) Amendment S-5042 to H. F. 2072, PROPERTY TAX BILL - Renters Credit was ruled out of order by Lt. Gov. Branstad. Vote was not taken. IFL against Lt. Governor's position.
- 3) Amendment S-5031 to H. F. 2072, PROPERTY TAX BILL -restored the ceiling on allowable growth to 6% rather than 4%. Yes vote IFL position. Ayes 12 - Nays 37 - Absent 1.
- 4) Amendment S-5135 to S-5104 to H. F. 747, LENGTH AND WEIGHT OF VEHICLES - allowed 65 foot double bottom trailers on certain Iowa highways. Yes vote IFL position. Ayes 26 - Nays 23 - Absent 1.
- 5) Amendment S-5153 to S. F. 2120, PRODUCT LIABILITY BILL - increased liability from 8 to 12 years. Yes vote IFL position. Ayes 23 - Nays 25 - Absent 2.
- 6) Motion to reconsider S-5148 to S. F. 2128, PRODUCT LIABILITY BILL - Yes vote IFL position. Ayes 29 - Nays 20 - Absent 1.
- 7) Amendment S-5148 to S. F. 2120, PRODUCT LIABILITY BILL - removed a third party from modification or alteration of a product in act against the manufacturer of the product. Yes vote IFL position. Ayes 26 - Nays 23 - Absent 1.
- 8) Amendment S-5235 to S. F. 2247, INDEXING STATE INCOME TAX - Raised the state surplus from 60 million to 75 million dollars. Yes vote is IFL position. Ayes 6 - Nays 41 - Absent 3.
- 9) Amendment S-5135 to S-5104 to H. F. 747, LENGTH AND WEIGHT OF VEHICLES - was reconsidered to allow 65 foot double bottom trailers on certian Iowa highways. Yes vote IFL position. Ayes 11 - Nays 36 - Absent 3.
- 10) Amendment S-5316 to S. F. 2292, BANKING BILL - deleted portion which allowed banks to charge for checking accounts above banks actual cost. Yes vote IFL position. Ayes 20 - Nays 26 - Absent 4.
- 11) H. F. 2251, SCHOOL FOUNDATION PLAN - reduced dollars going to local school districts and added additional burden on property tax. No vote is IFL position. Ayes 27 - Nays 21 - Absent 2.
- 12) S. F. 2375, REPEALED H. F. 2492, Section 15 and 16 - reinstited limits on variable interest mortgages. Yes vote is IFL position. Ayes 34 - Nays 11 - Present 2 - Absent 3.
- 13) S. F. 2247, RELATING TO THE INDEXING OF THE STATE INDIVIDUAL INCOME TAX - reduces income to the state of Iowa and continues the same regressive aspects of that tax. No vote is IFL position. Ayes 31 - Nays 16 - Absent 3.
- 14) Motion to suspend the ruling on germaneness of Amendment S-5903, PAY INCREASE FOR STATE EMPLOYEES, to H. F. 2580, APPROPRIATIONS BILL. Yes vote is IFL position. Ayes 20 - Nays 28 - Absent 2.
- 15) Appointment of KRENIO (KAY) POLYDORAN WRIGHT as a member of the PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT RELATIONS BOARD. No vote is IFL position. Ayes 32 - Nays 16 - Present 1 - Absent 1. Confirmation needs 2/3 vote or 34 votes.
