

IOWA HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES - ISSUES - 1984

1. House Amendment H-50538 to Senate File 190 (Relating to leaves of absence for persons who are elected to municipal, county, state or federal offices) allowed only a six month's leave of absence. MAY vote JFL position. Ayes 47 - Nays 49 - Absent 4.
2. House Amendment H-5086 to Senate File 190 (Relating to leaves of absence for persons who are elected to municipal, county, state or federal offices) required a six month notice to employer if elected official returned before length of leave of absence requested. MAY vote JFL position. Ayes 37 - Nays 58 - Absent 5.
3. House Amendment H-5083 to Senate File 190 (Relating to leaves of absence for persons who are elected to municipal, county, state or federal offices) guaranteed the job only if that job was still in existence. MAY vote JFL position. Ayes 40 - Nays 55 - Absent 5.
4. House File 2068 required certain public utilities to include in each of their ads a listing of the percentage of the ad's expenses which are to be charged to customers and the percentages which are to be charged to the stockholders. AYE vote JFL position. Ayes 73 - Nays 23 - Absent 4.
5. House File 2062 provided for a moratorium on certain disconnections of gas and electricity by regulated public utilities from October 1 to April 1 for residents age sixty or over. AYE vote JFL position. Ayes 59 - Nays 37 - Absent 4.
6. House File 2295 related to lotteries by providing for a state lottery. AYE vote JFL position. Ayes 53 - Nays 44 - Absent 3.
7. House File 2219 provided that an eligible elector residing in a precinct may register to vote at the polling place on election day (Vote 2/16/84). AYE vote JFL position. Ayes 63 - Nays 25 - Absent 12.
8. House File 2217 established a board of educational examiners to issue certificates and provide for their renewal. AYE vote JFL position. Ayes 55 - Nays 41 - Absent 4.
9. House Amendment H-5060 to amendment H-5368 to House File 426 (an Act requiring public improvement construction contracts to have provisions for the payment of at least the prevailing wage for laborers and mechanics), exempted all farm to market roads from the prevailing wage. MAY vote JFL position. Ayes 50 - Nays 48 - Absent 2.
10. House Amendment H-5670 to amendment H-5368 to House File 426 (an Act requiring public improvement construction contracts to have provisions for the payment of at least the prevailing wage for laborers and mechanics), transferred jurisdiction of enforcement from Bureau of Labor to Department of Transportation. MAY vote JFL position. Ayes 47 - Nays 52 - Absent 1.
11. House Amendment H-5663 to amendment H-5368 to House File 426 (an Act requiring public improvement construction contracts to have provisions for the payment of at least the prevailing wage for laborers and mechanics), required the publication of the change in cost of the specific project as a result of the imposition of prevailing wage rates. MAY vote JFL position. Ayes 44 - Nays 52 - Absent 4.
12. House Amendment H-5665 to Amendment H-5368 to House File 426 (an Act requiring public improvement construction contracts to have provisions for the payment of at least the prevailing wage for laborers and mechanics), required the publication of a list of the change in cost of each project for public improvement resulting from the imposition of prevailing wage rates under this Act. MAY vote JFL position. Ayes 41 - Nays 54 - Absent 5.
13. House File 426 required public improvement construction contracts to have provisions for the payment of at least the prevailing wage for laborers and mechanics. AYE vote JFL position. Ayes 57 - Nays 39 - Absent 4.
14. House Amendment H-5426 to House File 2433 (an Act amending Iowa's unemployment compensation law), froze weekly benefits if Iowa had a negative balance to the Federal Government. Speaker ruled H-5426 not germane and the vote recorded was to suspend the rules to consider H-5426. MAY vote JFL position. Ayes 34 - Nays 58 - Absent 8.
15. Reconsideration of House File 2295 relating to lotteries by providing for a state lottery. Motion was to override Governor's veto. AYE vote JFL position. Ayes 51 - Nays 45 - Absent 4.
16. Senate File 2168 related to the expansion of programs for returning dropouts and dropout prevention by a local school district. AYE vote JFL position. Ayes 66 - Nays 32 - Absent 2.
17. Senate File 190 relating to leaves of absence for persons who are elected to municipal, county, state or federal offices. AYE vote JFL position. Ayes 58 - Nays 39 - Absent 3.
18. Reconsideration of House File 2031 stipulated collective bargaining representation for employees of a district board of correctional services. Motion was to override Governor's veto. AYE vote JFL position. Ayes 59 - Nays 38 - Absent 3.
19. House File 2415 provided for the creation of a home equity line of credit with an interest rate not exceeding 1 3/4% per month or 21% per year. MAY vote JFL position. Ayes 63 - Nays 32 - Absent 5.
20. House Amendment H-6040 to Senate Amendment H-5860 to House File 2219 (provides that an eligible elector residing in a precinct may register to vote at the polling place on election day) eliminated a person not on election register from registering and casting a ballot on election day. Ayes 44 - Nays 52 - Absent 4.
21. House File 2219 provided that an eligible elector residing in a precinct may register to vote at the polling place on election day (Vote 4/4/84). AYE vote JFL position. Ayes 59 - Nays 39 - Absent 2.
22. House File 2062 provided for a moratorium on certain disconnections of gas and electricity by regulated public utilities from October 1 to April 1 for residents eligible for low income home energy assistance or weatherization assistance program. AYE vote JFL position. Ayes 75 - Nays 21 - Absent 4.
23. House File 2504 raised interest rate on any amount of taxes delinquent in excess of one thousand dollars per person on only one parcel of property. AYE vote JFL position. Ayes 52 - Nays 46 - Absent 2.
24. Senate File 244 related to the care given under workers' compensation medical benefits (Doctors choice). (Vote 4/13/84) AYE vote JFL position. Ayes 51 - Nays 45 - Absent 4.

EXPLANATION OF VOTES - IOWA SENATE - 1984

1. Senate Amendment S-5012 to Senate File 476 (Relating to the scope of negotiation in public employment contract negotiations) added only salary schedules, breaks and preparation time, early retirement programs and physical exams to the present law. NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 21 - Nays 27 - Absent 2.
2. Senate Amendment S-3370 to Senate File 476 (Relating to the scope of negotiation in public employment contract negotiations) strikes the new proposed language identifying 'confidential employees'. NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 19 - Nays 30 - Absent 1.
3. Senate Amendment S-3371 to Senate File 476 (Relating to the scope of negotiation in public employment contract negotiations) strikes the new proposed language dealing with principals and ass't principals as part of the bargaining unit. NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 24 - Nays 25 - Absent 1.
4. Senate Amendment S-3374 to Senate File 476 (Relating to the scope of negotiation in public employment contract negotiations) strikes the remedies of the Public Employment Relations Board. NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 15 - Nays 31 - Absent 4.
5. Senate Amendment S-3375A to Senate File 476 (Relating to the scope of negotiation in public employment contract negotiations) added only health and safety, staff reduction, supplemental pay and in service time to the present law. NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 18 - Nays 28 - Absent 4.
6. Senate Amendment S-3372 to Senate File 476 (Relating to the scope of negotiation in public employment contract negotiations) prevented the payroll check off for political activity committees. NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 18 - Nays 28 - Absent 4.
7. Senate Amendment S-5031 to Senate File 476 (Relating to the scope of negotiation in public employment contract negotiations) strikes discipline and discharge from proposed language. NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 17 - Nays 31 - Absent 2.
8. Senate Amendment S-5026 to Senate File 476 (Relating to the scope of negotiation in public employment contract negotiations) provides for only employees without a grievance procedure to use Chapter 279 of the Iowa Code (Teacher Termination). NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 19 - Nays 26 - Absent 5.
