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IOWA HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES - ISSUES - 1986

1. House File 2160, an Act relating to the prohibition of polygraph examinations as a condition of employment, and providing a penalty. AYE vote IFL position. Ayes 76 - Nays 24 - Absent 0.
2. House Amendment H-5206C to House File 2339 (an Act relating to the offense of operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or a drug) limited the use of a temporary license to and from residence to place of work, residence and evaluation or treatment center and residence and court ordered community service. NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 42 - Nays 54 - Absent 4.
3. House Amendment H-5181 to House File 2339 (an Act relating to the offense of operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or a drug) made deferred prosecution program for OMVUI as a part of your record as a previous violation (deferred prosecution for a previous violation does not appear on your record on any other type of offense). NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 43 - Nays 52 - Absent 5.
4. House Amendment H-5211 to House File 2339 (an Act relating to the offense of operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or a drug) permitted 60 day temporary permit upon completion of substance abuse evaluation or completed treatment program. This permit would allow travel to work, the grocery store, church, Little League, AA meetings, etc. AYE vote IFL position. Ayes 53 - Nays 43 - Absent 4.
5. House File 2199, an Act relating to unemployment compensation by modifying the formula for calculating the weekly benefit amount; by permanently setting the amount of taxable wages, and by making the one-week waiting period permanent. Rule 60 was invoked (withdraw a bill from committee and place on House floor). Motion was made that the motion to invoke Rule 60 be tabled. AYE vote IFL position. Ayes 60 - Nays 38 - Absent 2.
6. House File 2185, an Act relating to the maximum workers' compensation benefits payable to workers injured on or after the effective date of this Act. Motion was to withdraw House File 2185 from committee. NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 38 - Nays 57 - Absent 5.
7. House File 2376, an Act establishing liability of persons responsible for hazardous conditions for reasonable costs incurred by the Department of Water, Air and Waste Management in responding to the conditions, and providing for the credit of recoveries for the liabilities. AYE vote IFL position. Ayes 67 - Nays 29 - Absent 4.
8. Senate File 2049, an Act relating to the purchases of American made products and purchases from American based businesses. AYE vote IFL position. Ayes 65 - Nays 31 - Absent 4.
9. House Amendment H-5303 to Senate File 2167 (an Act relating to the liability of social hosts for injuries to persons as a result of intoxication) set up seven items for which action could be taken against the host for damages (in most cases you as an individual host could not have controlled, and in some cases would not be aware, such as serving alcohol to a person intoxicated by the legal definition .01 alcohol in the blood). NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 44 - Nays 48 - Absent 8.
10. Senate File 476, an Act to prohibit the relinquishment of prior seniority rights as a condition of employment. AYE vote IFL position. Ayes 70 - Nays 25 - Absent 5.
11. House Amendment H-5636 to Senate File 249 (an Act relating to workers' compensation benefits for persons domiciled in this state but injured outside the state) struck the section dealing with domicile. NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 32 - Nays 63 - Absent 5.
12. House Amendment H-5677 to Senate File 249 (an Act relating to workers' compensation benefits for persons domiciled in this state but injured outside the state) lowered maximum payments. Motion was to suspend Rule 31.8 (timely filing of amendments) to consider the amendment. NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 33 - Nays 55 - Absent 12.
13. Senate File 249, an Act relating to workers' compensation benefits for persons domiciled in this state but injured outside the state. AYE vote IFL position. Ayes 58 - Nays 34 - Absent 8.
14. House File 2476, an Act relating to public financing of political campaigns and providing penalties. AYE vote IFL position. Ayes 66 - Nays 32 - Absent 2.

15. House Amendment H-5783 to House File 2479 (an Act relating to the state individual income tax by altering the tax rates, increasing the standard deduction, eliminating the deduction for federal income taxes paid, except under certain circumstances) set a flat individual income tax at three and one-half percent (3½%). NAY vote IFL position.
Ayes 32 - Nays 65 - Absent 3.
16. House Amendment H-5623 to Committee amendment H-5575 to Senate File 2265 (an Act relating to civil liability by modifying statutory language relating to et.al.) set up a ten year limit on liability on manufacturer of defective products. NAY vote IFL position.
Ayes 47 - Nays 48 - Absent 5.
17. House Amendment H-5747 to Committee Amendment H-5575 to Senate File 2265 (an Act relating to civil liability by modifying statutory language relating to et.al.) gave cities immunity from liability on inspections. NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 47 - Nays 46 - Absent 7.
18. House Amendment H-5745 to Committee Amendment H-5575 to Senate File 2265 (an Act relating to civil liability by modifying statutory language relating to et.al.) eliminated punitive damages. NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 51 - Nays 47 - Absent 2.
19. House Amendment H-5692B to Committee Amendment H-5575 to Senate File 2265 (an Act relating to civil liability by modifying statutory language relating to et.al.) limited non-economic recovery of damages to \$250,000. NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 39 - Nays 58 - Absent 3.
20. House Amendment H-5731 to Committee Amendment H-5575 to Senate File 2265 (an Act relating to civil liability by modifying statutory language relating to et.al.) injured person cannot recover for subrogation. NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 40 - Nays 50 - Absent 10.
21. Senate File 2049 (Further amended by Senate) an Act relating to the purchases of American made products and purchases from American based businesses. AYE vote IFL position.
Ayes 59 - Nays 33 - Absent 8.
22. House Amendment H-6006 to House Amendment H-5989 to House File 2484 (an Act relating to making appropriations to agencies, boards, commissions, departments and programs of state government) provided Beer and Liquor Control Department shall maintain the existing warehouse personnel for the transition period of July 1, 1986 through June 30, 1987.
AYE vote IFL position. Ayes 51 - Nays 41 - Absent 8.
23. House Amendment H-6011 to House File 2484 (an Act relating to making appropriations to agencies, boards, commissions, departments and programs of state government) stated as a condition of this appropriation DOT shall do everything under its authority to qualify for Highway safety funds offered by the federal government under the alcohol traffic safety program (mandated a hard 30 day suspension of driving privileges for OMVUI - absolutely no driving by the offender for 30 days - not even to work). NAY VOTE IFL position. Ayes 45 - Nays 54 - Absent 1.
24. House Amendment H-6007 to House File 2484 (an Act relating to making appropriations to agencies, boards, commissions, departments and programs of state government) stated that a restricted drivers license would not be issued until 30 days after the revocation of a license which would prohibit the offender from driving for 30 days - not even to work.
NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 46 - Nays 53 - Absent 1.
25. Senate File 2294, an Act relating to the state individual and corporate income tax by limiting, modifying, eliminating and changing certain deductions and credits in computing the tax liability. Eliminated the oil drilling tax shelters. AYE vote IFL position.
Ayes 65 - Nays 27 - Absent 8.
26. House Amendment H-6091A to Amendment H-6073 to the Senate Amendment H-5822 to House File 2066 (an Act relating to Code corrections) repealed the one year payroll deduction of dues for public employees. NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 38 - Nays 54 - Absent 8.
27. House Amendment H-6091B to Amendment H-6073 to the Senate Amendment H-5822 to House File 2066 (an Act relating to Code corrections) repealed that personnel department rules do not supersede collective bargaining agreements in public sector bargaining. NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 33 - Nays 54 - Absent 13.
28. House Amendment H-6073 to Senate Amendment H-5822 to House File 2066 (an Act relating to Code corrections) eliminated the District Court from appeal process in Workers' Compensation cases (appeal is direct from Industrial Commissioner to Supreme Court). AYE vote IFL position. Ayes 60 - Nays 31 - Absent 9.
29. House Amendment H-6114 to House File 2492 (an Act relating to compensation for department directors and other public officials) removed raises and per diem increases for legislators.
NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 38 - Nays 57 - Absent 5.

EXPLANATION OF VOTES - IOWA SENATE - 1986

1. Senate Amendment S-5108 to Senate File 2175 (relating to the organization and structure of state government) struck that portion of the bill which expanded the duration of state payroll deduction for dues to employee organizations from one month to one year. NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 20 - Nays 27 - Absent 3.
2. Senate Amendment S-5129 to Senate File 2175 (relating to the organization and structure of state government) struck that portion of the bill which established the older Iowans' Legislative Program. NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 17 - Nays 32 - Absent 1.
3. Senate File 199 relating to leaves of absence for a public employee who is a candidate for elective public office. AYE vote IFL position. Ayes 31 - Nays 15 - Absent 4.
4. Senate File 2256 relating to the Senate's review and confirmation of gubernatorial appointments, required proof that gubernatorial appointees subject to Senate confirmation have filed federal and state tax returns for three years preceding appointment. AYE vote IFL position. Ayes 26 - Nays 22 - Absent 2.
5. Senate Amendment S-5411 to Senate Amendment S-5397 to Senate File 2265 (relating to civil liability) required that a claimant must plead and prove that the defendant's action constituted actual malice, then the judge shall assess the amount of punitive or exemplary damages. NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 21 - Nays 25 - Absent 4.
6. Senate File 461, an Act requiring coverage under group policies of accident and health insurance, group hospital or medical and surgical service contracts, and health maintenance organization health care services plans, and requiring the offering of coverage under individual policies of accident and health insurance, for the treatment of chemical dependency and mental disorders on substantially the same basis as other physical health care coverages, with certain limitations. (Bill as amended in the House allowed only for a mandated offering.) NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 27 - Nays 21 - Absent 2.
7. Senate File 2082 relating to the sales, services, and use tax exemption for and the refund of sales, services, and use taxes paid on the purchase or rental of replacement parts for certain machinery, equipment, and computers. NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 28 - Nays 20 - Absent 2.
8. Senate Amendment S-5905 to Senate Amendment S-5791 to House File 2484 (relating to and making appropriations to agencies, boards, commissions, departments and programs of state government.) Reduced the budget by one percent. NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 24 - Nays 24 - Absent 2.
9. Senate Amendment S-5923 to Senate File 2298 (relating to state revenues for education by limiting the amount of federal taxes deductible for individual income tax and by using the increase in revenue to lower the school foundation property tax levy) increased the state sales tax to five percent. NAY vote IFL position. Ayes 18 - Nays 31 - Absent 1.
10. House File 2066 relating to Code corrections, included deleting the District Court appeal from Workers' Compensation appeals from the Industrial Commissioner. AYE vote IFL position. Ayes 34 - Nays 9 - Absent 7.
