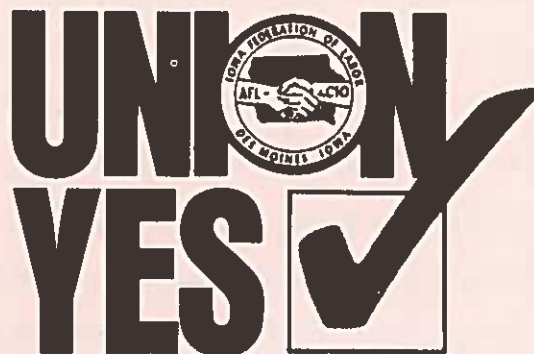

1993 VOTING RECORD IOWA GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Samuel Gompers said it best when he described labor's political mission nearly a century ago: "Stand faithfully by our friends and elect them; oppose our enemies and defeat them, whether they be candidates for President, for Congress, or other offices, whether executive, legislative or judicial."

Not words but the record is the measure of how we separate labor's allies from our adversaries. This voting record by no means covers all the issues that the Iowa Federation of Labor, AFL-CIO dealt with during the 1993 Legislative session. It does, however, record legislators' votes on a number of key issues of concern to union members and their families and will help Iowa trade unionists determine whether their elected representatives support labor's progressive agenda or have taken their stand with those who want to keep working people down.

SENATE -- ISSUES -- 1993

1. SF411 -- allows some bond issues to be decided by 50% plus one rather than 60% plus one when based on a combination of property and income tax. IFL position was "YES."
(Adopted 32-15)
2. HF22 -- establishes the state percent of growth for the school budget year beginning July 1, 1993. The Governor's budget provided for 2.3% growth. The Senate concurred. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 27-22)
3. SF127 -- allows employees to use lawful products when on their own time. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 36-11)
4. SF11 -- establishes agricultural enterprise zones in which operators could receive substantial tax breaks and immunity from nuisance suits. IFL position was "NO."
(Adopted 38-6)
5. SF314 -- provides for changes in Iowa OSHA necessary to comply with federal OSHA. Also covers railroad sanitation under OSHA. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 27-22)
6. Amendment S3719 to SF424 -- expands employee drug testing to include pre-employment testing without a physical, post-accident testing and random testing of employees who have undergone treatment for drug abuse. IFL position was "NO."
(Defeated 21-29)
7. SF357 -- requires development of a strategic plan for privatizing state functions. IFL position was "YES."
(Adopted 46-4)
8. Amendment S3558 to SF411 -- requires bond issues to pass by 60% plus one even when based on a combination of income and property tax. IFL position was "NO." (Defeated 18-29)
9. Amendment S3753 to SF426 -- expands the kinds of businesses allowed to use tax exemptions for machinery and equipment. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 25-23)
10. SF275 -- sets up an advisory council to study critical state infrastructure needs. IFL position was "YES."
(Adopted 26-22)
11. SF398 -- allows landlords to collect two months' rent plus deposit from new tenants. IFL position was "NO."
(Adopted 47-1)
12. Amendment 3620 to SF411 -- requires bond issues to pass by 55% plus one when based on a combination of income and property tax. IFL position was "NO." (Defeated 22-24)

1. HF22 -- establishes the state percent of growth for the school budget year beginning July 1, 1993. The Governor's budget called for 2.3% growth. The House bill provided for only 1.6%. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 51-49)
2. HF65 -- changes the elements of the public offense of stalking by striking the requirement that the credible threat be without legitimate purpose. Labor unions' ability to picket or organize could be severely hampered by such legislation. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 92-7)
3. Amendment H3209 to HF429 -- retains the requirement that hospitals collect severity and outcome data for use by the Health Data Commission in analyzing health care performance. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 50-47)
4. Amendment H3889 to SF233 -- eliminates language that would have allowed universities to retain part-time student help while laying off full-time permanent employees. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 50-46)
5. HF602 -- allows employers to expand their ability to test employees by providing for pre-employment drug-testing apart from a physical, post-accident testing, and random testing following treatment for drug abuse. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 73-27)
6. HF208 -- changes Chapter 20 to establish the authority of the PERB, on review of a proposed decision by the administrative law judge, to conduct a new evidentiary hearing. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 51-48)
7. HF559 -- allows employers to collect on future benefits received by claimants following a third party settlement under Workers' Compensation. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 52-46)
8. Amendment H3669 SF266 -- funds any shortfall in the Division of Labor or the Division of Industrial Services. IFL position was "YES." (Defeated 48-51)
9. Amendment H4362 to SF425 -- strikes railroad sanitation language from being included under OSHA. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 50-49)
10. HF676 -- allows property tax exemption for businesses purchasing new machinery and equipment. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 70-29)
11. Amendment H3399 to HF518 -- allows a self-employed individual's tools of the trade to be disregarded when considering resources under AFDC. IFL position was "YES." (Defeated 44-50)
12. SF398 -- allows landlords to charge two month's rent plus deposit to new tenants. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 83-15)
13. Amendment H3445 to HF518 -- allows child care assistance to be taken out of lottery revenue. Vote was taken on a motion to suspend the rules to allow the amendment. IFL position was "YES." (Defeated 47-51)
14. Amendment H3430 to HF518 -- reduces upper level management in state government and gives the first \$250,000 saved to counties for Mental Health. IFL position was "YES." (Defeated 46-51)
15. Amendment H3456 to HF518 -- requires departments under this act to receive approval from the Executive Council or General Assembly before privatizing. This would make it more difficult for state government to privatize. IFL position was "YES." (Defeated 47-50)
16. Amendment H3019 to HF22 -- raises percentage growth in education to 2.3% to concur with Senate. IFL position was "YES." (Defeated 47-51)
17. Amendment H3214 to HF208 -- eliminates language that allows the PERB to conduct a new evidentiary hearing when reviewing a proposed decision by the administrative law judge. IFL position is "YES." (Defeated 48-51)
