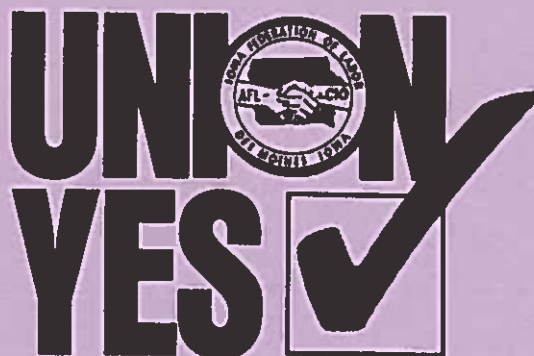

1994 VOTING RECORD IOWA GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Samuel Gompers said it best when he described labor's political mission nearly a century ago: "Stand faithfully by our friends and elect them; oppose our enemies and defeat them, whether they be candidates for President, for Congress, or other offices, whether executive, legislative or judicial."

Not words but the record is the measure of how we separate labor's allies from our adversaries. This voting record by no means covers all the issues that the Iowa Federation of Labor, AFL-CIO dealt with during the 1994 Legislative session. It does, however, record legislators' votes on a number of key issues of concern to union members and their families and will help Iowa trade unionists determine whether their elected representatives support labor's progressive agenda or have taken their stand with those who want to keep working people down.

Senate Issues — 1994

1. HF 2180 — provides incentives and tax breaks of up to \$73 million for IPSCO, a Canadian Steel Company to locate in Iowa. The bill exempts IPSCO, and potentially others, from paying county taxes without providing replacement tax revenues. It also is unfair to existing Iowa companies that provide good jobs without such incentives. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 32 - 17)
2. Amendment S5030B to HF 2180 — qualifies businesses for economic incentives under the New Jobs and Income Act only if they pay for at least 80% of employee health care coverage under a comprehensive plan. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 24 - 23)
3. Amendment S5042A to HF 2180 — excludes employer contributions to health insurance and pension plans as part of base wage required for qualification under the New Jobs and Income Act. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 24 - 23)
4. Amendment S5040 to HF 2180 — eliminates businesses that have a history of violation of environmental or OSHA laws from being considered for incentives and tax breaks under the New Jobs and Income Act. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 24 - 23)
5. SF 2041 — establishes the percentage of allowable growth at 3% for the school budget year beginning July 1, 1994. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 32 - 13)
6. SF 2222 — provides for universal health care coverage for all Iowans by 1998, and a task force to recommend components of a comprehensive benefit plan, cost containment strategy, and fair financing, including the possibility of an employer mandate or a single-payer plan. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 26 - 24)
7. SF 2215 — couples Iowa Tax Code with the federal Internal Revenue Code, except for the taxation of Social Security benefits. This gives well-to-do seniors (those making over \$44,000) a state tax break. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 48 - 1)
8. HF 2430 — continues the property tax freeze at the county level for two more years. Such freezes limit counties' ability to provide for public needs and jeopardize public workers' jobs and pay. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 38 - 12)
9. SF 2162 — provides for safe transportation of railway employees in rail cars that are well-ventilated and free of diesel fumes. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 39 - 7)
10. HF 542 — deals with issues of public health including lead abatement. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 32 - 17. Held in Senate on motion to reconsider.)
11. HF 2415 — appropriates funds for economic development, including \$450,000 for apprenticeship programs at community colleges. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 40 - 5)
12. SF 2089 — establishes the Iowa Telecommunications and Technology Commission to set policy for the fiber optics network and make recommendations for future decisions by the Legislature. The bill provides for an executive director to administer day to day operations. Part III will be leased from private firms, thus saving union members' jobs. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 42 - 7)
13. SF 2245 — improves current Workers' Compensation law by providing for: 1) a stay on collection proceedings in contested cases, 2) lost time pay for certain injured workers, 3) higher minimum benefits, 4) transfer of temporary benefits if working for another employer, and 5) employer credit for overpayment. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 50 - 0)

House Issues -- 1994

1. Amendment H5011 to SF 2041 -- reduces to 2.1% from 3% the percentage of allowable growth for the school budget year beginning July 1, 1994. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 51 - 44)
2. Amendment H5074 to HF 2180 -- requires that businesses in a "quality jobs enterprise zone" guarantee that they will create at least 300 full-time jobs to qualify for incentives and tax breaks. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 71 - 26)
3. Amendment H5080 to HF 2180 -- makes day care availability for employees a requirement for businesses in a "quality jobs enterprise zone" rather than one of several options to qualify for incentives and tax breaks. IFL position was "YES." (Defeated 48 - 50)
4. Amendment H5049 to HF 2180 -- requires approval by referendum by a majority of county voters before a business can receive an exemption from property taxes in a "quality jobs enterprise zone." IFL position was "YES." (Defeated 34 - 63)
5. HF 2180 -- provides incentives and tax breaks of up to \$73 million for IPSCO, a Canadian Steel Company to locate in Iowa. The bill exempts IPSCO, and potentially others, from paying county taxes without providing replacement tax revenues. It also is unfair to existing businesses that provide good jobs without receiving incentives. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 59 - 38)
6. Motion to pull SF 2222 from committee for immediate consideration. SF 2222, passed by the Senate, provides for universal health care coverage for all Iowans by 1998, and a task force to recommend components of a comprehensive benefit plan, cost containment strategy, and fair financing, including the possibility of an employer mandate or a single-payer plan. Republican House leadership was holding the bill up in committee and not allowing debate. This motion from the floor would release the bill. IFL position was "YES." (Defeated 48 - 51)
7. SF 2215 -- couples Iowa Tax Code with the federal Internal Revenue Code, except for the taxation of Social Security benefits. This gives well-to-do seniors (those making over \$44,000) a state tax break. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 94 - 5)
8. HF 2430 -- continues the property tax freeze at the county level for two more years. Such freezes limit counties' ability to provide for public needs and jeopardize public workers' jobs and pay. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 94 - 6)
9. Motion to suspend rules to consider amendment H 5494 to HF 2415 -- would have allowed debate on letting cities establish housing trust funds. Such funds provide needed housing for low and moderate income families and create additional construction jobs. IFL position was "YES." (Defeated 44 - 53)
10. Amendment H5932 to amendment H5907 -- allows a person to obtain information regarding motor vehicle registration from the Department of Transportation, providing they leave their name and address on file with the department. Without this amendment organizing and picketing activities would be hindered. IFL position was "YES." (Defeated 38 - 62)
11. Amendment H6055 to HF 2418 -- allows public employee retirement contributions to be made on a pre-tax basis. IFL position was "YES." (Defeated 47 - 49)
12. SF 2089 -- provides for state ownership of Part III of the Iowa Communications Network. The House amendments adopted would drive the state deeper into debt as well as jeopardize union members' jobs by not leasing Part III from private firms. IFL position was "NO." (Adopted 55 - 44)
13. SF 2245 -- improves current Workers' Compensation law by providing for: 1) a stay on collection proceedings in contested cases, 2) lost time pay for certain injured workers, 3) higher minimum benefits, 4) transfer of temporary benefits if working for another employer, and 5) employer credit for overpayment. IFL position was "YES." (Adopted 100 - 0)
