

## EXPLANATION OF VOTES - SENATE

1. Senate File 92 - a bill for an Act to permit pari-mutuel betting in Iowa. YES vote IFL position. Ayes 28 - Nays 21 - Absent 1.
2. Senate Amendment 3175 to Senate File 289 eliminated the 1% sales tax from local option tax by replacing the word one percent with zero percent. YES vote IFL position. Ayes 24 - Nays 24 - Absent 2.
3. Senate File 289 - a bill for an Act relating to the imposition of a local option income surtax, vehicle tax, sales and services tax and payroll tax by a city or county. NO vote IFL position. Ayes 21 - Nays 27 - Absent 2.
4. Senate Amendment 3210 to Senate File 386 eliminated the tax credit for solar domestic hot water system from the updating of the Iowa Internal Revenue Code. NO vote IFL position. Ayes 18 - Nays 30 - Absent 2.
5. Senate Amendment 3203 to Senate File 386 eliminated the state minimum tax on individuals and corporations and kept financial institutions' tax at present level; updating of Iowa Internal Revenue Code. NO vote IFL position. Ayes 18 - Nays 30 - Absent 2.
6. Senate Amendment 3205 to Senate File 386 eliminated removing Unemployment Compensation from Iowa net income; updating of Iowa Internal Revenue Code. NO vote IFL position. Ayes 20 - Nays 27 - Absent 3.
7. Senate Amendment 3204 to Senate File 386 eliminated medical deduction from update of Iowa Internal Revenue Code. NO vote IFL position. Ayes 22 - Nays 27 - Absent 1.
8. Senate File 386 - a bill for an Act relating to taxation by updating references to the Iowa Internal Revenue Code for individual and corporate income tax. YES vote IFL position. Ayes 26 - Nays 23 - Absent 1.
9. Senate File 246 - a bill for an act relating to city housing codes making it optional to include a program of regular rental inspections as part of the city enforcement procedures. NO vote IFL position. Ayes 26 - Nays 18 - Absent 6.
10. Senate File 461 - a bill for an Act to establish a tax study committee to conduct a study of the tax structure in this state and making an appropriation. YES vote IFL position. Ayes 33 - Nays 15 - Absent 2.
11. Senate File 190 - a bill for an Act relating to leaves of absence for persons who are elected to municipal, county, state, or federal offices. YES vote IFL position. Ayes 31 - Nays 15 - Absent 4.
12. Senate Amendment 3893 to Division 3887C to House File 641 eliminated the ability of Department of Social Services from obtaining all financial information from Financial Institutions on Social Service clients. House File 641 is the Appropriations bill for Department of Social Services except for correctional and mental health programs. YES vote IFL position. Ayes 27 - Nays 19 - Absent 4.
13. Senate Amendment 3917 to Senate Amendment 3912 to House File 637 changed requirements for suitable work in the amount of wages offered an unemployed worker from 100% to 85% during the first five weeks of unemployment and from 70% to 65% after the twelfth week of unemployment. House File 637 was the Unemployment Compensation Bill. NO vote IFL position. Ayes 19 - Nays 28 - Absent 3.
14. House File 637 - a bill for an Act relating to the computation of employer contribution rates and employee benefits under Iowa's unemployment law. YES vote IFL position. Ayes 29 - Nays 20 - Absent 1.
15. Senate File 548 - a bill for an Act for the purpose of improving the Iowa economy and providing improved employment conditions. YES vote IFL position. Ayes 31 - Nays 13 - Absent 6.

## VOTING RECORD OF THE IOWA HOUSE 1983

1. House Amendment H-3119 to House Amendment H-3117 to House File 196 allowed a publicly elected hospital trustee to serve as a consumer-subscriber director of a service corporation (i.e. Blue Cross-Shield). House File 196 - a bill for an Act relating to health care by providing for the creation of directors of nonprofit hospital service corporations, nonprofit medical service corporation (i.e. Blue Cross-Blue Shield).  
NO vote IFL position. Ayes 35 - Nays 58 - Absent 7.
2. House Amendment H-3264 to Senate File 386, lowered the total income subject to income tax if some of your income was unemployment insurance in updating the Iowa Internal Revenue Code.  
NO vote IFL position. Ayes 37 - Nays 59 - Absent 4.
3. House Amendment H-3263 to Senate File 386, allowed for a standard deduction of 15% of net income after deduction of Federal Income Taxes not to exceed \$1,200 (married - filing separate), \$1,200 (single) and \$3,000 (joint) in updating of the Iowa Internal Revenue Code.  
NO vote IFL position. Ayes 30 - Nays 61 - Absent 9.
4. House Amendment H-3268 to Senate File 386 would have allowed only \$15,000 Federal Income Tax deduction from the Iowa Income Tax return, in updating the Iowa Internal Revenue Code.  
YES vote IFL position. Ayes 23 - Nays 69 - Absent 8.
5. Senate File 386 - a bill for an Act relating to taxation by updating references to the Iowa Internal Revenue Code for individual and corporate income tax.  
YES vote IFL position. Ayes 58 - Nays 36 - Absent 6.
6. House Joint Resolution 2 proposed an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to provide for representation of the District of Columbia in the Congress.  
YES vote IFL position. Ayes 62 - Nays 32 - Absent 4.
7. House File 563 - a bill for an Act relating to the authorization of the Iowa Department of Transportation to issue and become obligated for road use tax revenue bonds.  
YES vote IFL position. Ayes 58 - Nays 41 - Absent 1.
8. House Amendment H- 3481 to House File 562 removed the Drop-Out Program from the Iowa Public School System, in the bill for an Act to provide for the establishment of programs for teachers of science and mathematics.  
NO vote IFL position. Ayes 28 - Nays 69 - Absent 3.
9. House Amendment H-3437 to House File 562 was the Governor's plan for the school state foundation base of 80% of the state cost per pupil in the bill for an Act to provide for the establishment of programs for teachers of science and mathematics.  
NO vote IFL position. Ayes 28 - Nays 66 - Absent 6.
10. House File 37 - a bill for an Act relating to the use of polygraph examinations as a condition of employment and concurrence with Senate Amendment H-3713 which allowed the test in selecting a candidate for employment as a peace officer.  
YES vote IFL position. Ayes 69 - Nays 28 - Absent 3.
11. House Amendment H-3664 to Senate Concurrent Resolution 13, stated that projects constructed under the authority of this Resolution shall comply with the building code adopted by the city in which the project is located. The Resolution dealt with Regent's bonding for academic buildings.  
YES vote IFL position. Ayes 23 - Nays 72 - Absent 5.
12. House Amendment H- 3706 to Senate Concurrent Resolution 13, provided that construction contracts contain a provision to the effect that the rate of wage for all persons employed by the contractors or sub-contractors shall not be less than the prevailing rate of wages in that locality. The Resolution dealt with Regent's bonding for academic buildings. The vote was to suspend the rules so that H-3706 may be considered.  
YES vote IFL position. Ayes 40 - Nays 58 - Absent 2.
13. House Amendment H-3813 to Senate Concurrent Resolution 13, provided an overall goal for the participation of women's and minority business enterprises of five percent of the proceeds from the issuance of the bonds. The Resolution dealt with Regent's bonding for academic buildings. The vote was to suspend the rules so that H-3813 may be considered.  
YES vote IFL position. Ayes 36 - Nays 62 - Absent 2.
14. House Amendment H-3891 to House File 637 decreased total benefits paid to an individual by five times the individual's weekly benefit if the individual had been disqualified for misconduct or voluntary quit; raised qualification for benefits from 1 1/2 to 1 1/4 and minimum \$400 to 3.5% of the state average annual wage (Approx. \$500); instituted one week waiting period. House File 637 was a bill for an Act relating to the computation of employer contribution rates and employee benefits under Iowa's unemployment law.  
NO vote IFL position. Ayes 37 - Nays 61 - Absent 2.

15. House Amendment H-3896 to House File 637 made an individual ineligible for benefits in the event the employer called you back to work after scheduling a plant shutdown, vacation, inventory not to exceed four weeks. House File 637 was a bill for an Act relating to the computation of employer contribution rates and employee benefits under Iowa's unemployment law.  
NO vote IFL position. Ayes 38 - Nays 57 - Absent 5.
16. House Amendment H-3881 to House File 637 lowered qualifications for benefits from 1 1/3 to 1 1/4. House File 637 was a bill for an Act relating to the computation of employer contribution rates and employee benefits under Iowa's unemployment law.  
YES vote IFL position. Ayes 46 - Nays 52 - Absent 2.
17. House Amendment H-3889 to House File 637 added a one week period before benefits were started. House File 637 was a bill for an Act relating to the computation of employer contribution rates and employee benefits under Iowa's unemployment law.  
NO vote IFL position. Ayes 43 - Nays 55 - Absent 2.
18. House Amendment H-3761 to Senate File 380 proposed that all construction work under Senate File 380 be accomplished under "Prevailing Wage". Senate File 380 is a bill relating to projects for which industrial revenue bonds may be issued by a city or county. The vote was to suspend the rules to consider H-3761.  
YES vote IFL position. Ayes 37 - Nays 57 - Absent 6.
19. House File 646 - a bill for an Act relating to the compensation and benefits for public officials and employees.  
YES vote IFL position. Ayes 53 - Nays 43 - Absent 4.
20. House Amendment H-4089A to Senate File 448 would not allow a teacher to file a grievance in a termination case. Senate File 448 was a bill for an Act relating to the issuance, terminations and requirements for teachers' contracts.  
NO vote IFL position. Ayes 37 - Nays 55 - Absent 8.
21. House Amendment H-4136 to House File 653 removed the designation of Title III funds to conform with designated service delivery areas approved by the Governor under Titles I & II. House File 653 a bill for an Act to establish a job training partnership program.  
YES vote IFL position. Ayes 42 - Nays 54 - Absent 4.
22. House Amendment H-4122A to Senate File 548 raised appropriations for the Jobs Bill from \$3,050,000 to \$5,550,000 and to OPP from \$1,500,000 to \$4,000,000. Senate File 548 a bill for an Act for the purpose of improving the Iowa economy and providing improved employment conditions.  
YES vote IFL position. Ayes 54 - Nays 40 - Absent 6.
23. Senate File 548 - a bill for an Act for the purpose of improving the Iowa economy and providing improved employment conditions.  
YES vote IFL position. Ayes 66 - Nays 29 - Absent 5.
24. House Amendment H-4184 to Senate File 551 proposed that all construction work under Senate File 551 be accomplished under "Prevailing Wage". Senate File 551 - a bill for an Act relating to and making appropriations for capital projects. The vote was to suspend the rules to consider H-4184.  
YES vote IFL position. Ayes 37 - Nays 59 - Absent 4.
25. House Amendment H-4247 to Senate Amendment H-4223 to House File 637 increased qualification for employment benefits from 1 1/4 to 1 1/3 your high quarter earnings. House File 637, a bill for an Act relating to the computation of employer contribution rates and employee benefits under Iowa's unemployment law.  
NO vote IFL position. Ayes 37 - Nays 57 - Absent 6.
26. House Amendment H-4245 to Senate Amendment H-4223 to House File 637 eliminated the increase in taxable wages; subject to unemployment tax. House File 637, a bill for an Act relating to the computation of employer contribution rates and employee benefits under Iowa's unemployment law.  
NO vote IFL position. Ayes 37 - Nays 57 - Absent 6.
27. House Amendment H-4249 to Senate Amendment H-4223 to House File 637 made the one week waiting period permanent; and made it effective on July 3, 1983, instead of January 6, 1985. House File 637, a bill for an Act relating to the computation of employer contribution rates and employee benefits under Iowa's unemployment law.  
NO vote IFL position. Ayes 36 - Nays 55 - Absent 9.
28. House File 637, a bill for an Act relating to the computation of employer contribution rates and employee benefits under Iowa's unemployment law.  
YES vote IFL position. Ayes 61 - Nays 34 - Absent 5.
