

Registration Forms

Voter registration forms:

- You may use either an [Iowa state form](#) or the [federal mail-in voter registration form](#) for your voter registration drive.
 - You may photocopy blank forms.
 - Contact your [county auditor](#) or the Secretary of State to request additional copies of the Iowa state form.
- Iowa residents can also register to vote [online](#) if they have an Iowa driver's license or identification card and a social security number.

Rules for conducting a voter registration drive:

- Iowa does not impose any restrictions on who can assist with voter registration efforts, nor does it require organizations to submit any paperwork before beginning a voter registration drive.
- You may use either [Iowa state form](#) or the [federal mail-in voter registration form](#) for your voter registration drive.
 - You may photocopy blank forms.
 - Contact your [county auditor](#) or the Secretary of State to request additional copies of the Minnesota state form.
- Do not fill in missing information or make corrections on a registration form without the consent of the person registering to vote. Review the completed form while the registrant is still with you (and be sure they have checked the boxes answering the questions about their citizenship and age), so you can ask them to correct any errors or omissions before you take the form.
- You must submit **all** applications that you receive within seven days, except that applications you receive within three days before the voter registration deadline must be submitted within 24 hours.
- Deliver completed registration forms to the voters' [county auditor or commissioner of elections](#).
- Do not pay anyone based on the number of voter registration forms they collect.
- Do not offer any form of compensation or other incentive to potential registrants for completing a voter registration form.
